CURRICULUM VITAE PAOLO FRATTER

Paolo Fratter was born in Treviso on June 29th, 1975

He attended the high school in classical studies from where he graduated in 1994 In 2002 he got a degree in publishing and journalism

From 1995 to 2003 he contributed to a local tv, Antenna 3 Nordest, mainly reporting for the news section and roughly in the same period he started anchoring the news bulletins for the same tv

In 2003 he started working for Skytg24, Italy's first all-news tv channel, and he's been working there ever since as a news anchor and a reporter, especially in crisis areas.

He has been reporting among other things on the war in Afghanistan, the migrants' crisis both along the Balkan and the Mediterranean route, the tensions in the Niger delta, the earthquake in central Italy in 2016, the pandemic in Italy and Europe, the explosion in the port of Beirut and most recently the earthquake in Turkey.

He's also been involved, from a journalistic perspective, with the Cinemarena project (an itinerant project that was launched in 2001 from the Italian Cooperation in Mozambique)

which brings him often to Mozambique and Burkina Faso and in 2020 he took part as an activist in one of the campaigns sponsored by IOM in Senegal.

In 2018 He obtained the SSAFE certification (SAFE AND SECURE APPROACHES IN FIELD ENVIRONMENTS) about the behavioral rules to be observed in crisis areas. In 2022 he attended the "HOSTILE ENVIROMENT AND FIRST AID TRAINING" in Turnbridge Wells (organized by First Option for Sky) for reporters in war areas.
